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#### **ACHIEVEMENT PIN APPLICATIONS**

Achievement pins are awarded to 4-Hers who have been active in 4-H projects, leadership and other 4-H related activities. Pin applications should contain 4-H activities from October 1, 2020 through September 30, 2021. If you have activities that take place between the date you have to turn them into the club leader and Sept. 30<sup>th</sup>, go ahead and list them. Achievement pins (in order of increasing requirements) are:

1-Membership 6-Silver Guard 2-Bronze 7-Leadership 3-Clover 8-Gold 4-Emerald 9-Gold Guard

5-Silver

If you need Achievement pin applications, check our website, click on 4-H forms and achievement pin applications.

The link will be in the bottom right hand corner.

All applications must be turned in to your <u>CLUB LEADER</u>. Check with your club leader to see what date you have to turn them into the club leader. Club Leaders: Pin Applications are due on Friday, October 8, 2021 by 5 pm.

Achievement pins will be awarded at Achievement Night the date & location to be announced at a later date.

### LET THE FUNDRAISING BEGIN

The Reno County 4-H Council fundraising committee has decided that we will sell cookie dough again this year. We as a county will be selling cookie dough from the Little Ol' Cookie House out of Little River. This cookie dough is from a small-town business and is amazing. We are asking for each youth in 4-H to sell at least 1 container of cookie dough. We have 11 flavors and you can buy it either in a 3lb tub or in proportioned form which is 3 dozen cookies that are ready to drop on a tray and cook. We do make \$1 more with each tube of cookie dough (you just need to scoop it out of the tube) that is sold over the proportioned cookies. We are selling both forms of dough for \$15 each.

You can start selling cookie dough as soon as you get your packet. Your order form and money are due back to the Extension Office November 1st. Please have all checks made out to 4-H Council. Pick up date will be November 23rd from 12 to 6pm at the back of the Extension Office.

Now let's talk prizes, for the top 5 sellers of the cookie dough we will have some great prizes. The person selling the most will have first pick of the prizes down the line till all 5 are picked. Take a look below to see what you might have a chance to win. Also, for the club that sells the most we will have something special for you.

How can we sell the cookie dough and stay Covid safe you ask? With the help of your parents you can call, email or facebook your friends, family, co workers anyone you know. But how will I deliver it safely? Drop and go, call the person that bought the cookie dough tell them you are on the way and drop it on their door step.
