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#### **ACHIEVEMENT PIN APPLICATIONS**

Achievement pins are awarded to 4-Hers who have been active in 4-H projects, leadership and other 4-H related activities. Pin applications should contain 4-H activities from October 1, 2020 through September 30, 2021. If you have activities that take place between the date you have to turn them into the club leader and Sept. 30<sup>th</sup>, go ahead and list them. Achievement pins (in order of increasing requirements) are:

1-Membership 6-Silver Guard
2-Bronze 7-Leadership
3-Clover 8-Gold
4-Emerald 9-Gold Guard

5-Silver

If you need Achievement pin applications, check our website, click on 4-H forms and achievement pin applications. The link will be in the bottom right hand corner.

All applications must be turned in to your <u>CLUB LEADER</u>. Check with your club leader to see what date you have to turn them into the club leader. <u>Club Leaders</u>: <u>Pin Applications are due on Friday</u>, <u>October 8</u>, <u>2021 by 5 pm</u>. Achievement pins will be awarded at Achievement Night the date & location to be announced at a later date.

#### **RECORD BOOKS**

I encourage each 4-Her to complete a record book and turn it into their club leader (please do not bring them to the office – your club leader will do that). Again this year only record books will be turned in and judged for county medals. Forms for record keeping can be found on the K State Extension 4-H website https://www.kansas4-h.org/index.html.

Dear Friends,

As many of you know Kirk was diagnosed with end stage liver disease almost five years ago. According to his physicians at Mayo Clinic he needs a liver transplant. The priority for livers is highest for the sickest patients. His best chance to get a liver transplant is to receive a liver from a living donor. The remaining liver grows back in the donor and the part that is donated also grows to the size that is needed for Kirk. The donor evaluation process takes several steps, beginning with a questionnaire which can be done online or over the phone. Potential donors need to be between 21 and 59 years of age and in good general health. There are several subsets of blood types that would be compatible and that is best discussed with the transplant team.

We are aware that this is a huge decision to make and have struggled with making this request of anyone, however it has become clear to us that this is the only avenue for improved health and life for us.

Anyone who is interested in being a potential liver donor may go on-line to complete a donor screening at <a href="mailto:LivingDonorOrganTP@mayo.edu">LivingDonorOrganTP@mayo.edu</a> or they can call 866-227-1569 to talk to a nurse coordinator to complete the donor health screening questions. We have a limited amount of information that we would be happy to share with you as well.
