#### **Kansas Youth Leadership Forum Updates**

The Kansas Youth Leadership Forum (KYLF) will be held November 19-20, 2022 at Rock Springs 4-H Center. KYLF is for youth ages 14-18 before January 1, 2023. KYLF will feature leadership workshops, Youth Council Elections, and opportunities to learn and have fun.

There will also be an option for coming in Friday evening and having breakfast Saturday morning for those coming from a distance.

Registration will open in late August/early September. Registration deadline is October 15, 2022. Please note - This is earlier than the past. Once registration is open, a note will be sent to the KSRE system.

#### **ACHIEVEMENT PIN APPLICATIONS**

Achievement pins are awarded to 4-Hers who have been active in 4-H projects, leadership and other 4-H related activities. Pin applications should contain 4-H activities from October 1, 2020 through September 30, 2021. If you have activities that take place between the date you have to turn them into the club leader and Sept. 30<sup>th</sup>, go ahead and list them. Achievement pins (in order of increasing requirements) are:

1-Membership 6-Silver Guard 2-Bronze 7-Leadership 3-Clover 8-Gold 4-Emerald 9-Gold Guard

5-Silver

If you need Achievement pin applications, check our website, click on 4-H forms and achievement pin applications. The link will be in the bottom right-hand corner.

All applications must be turned in to your <u>CLUB LEADER</u>. Check with your club leader to see what date you have to turn them into the club leader. <u>Club Leaders</u>: <u>Pin Applications are due on Friday</u>, <u>October 7</u>, <u>2022</u>, <u>by 5 pm</u>. Achievement pins will be awarded at Achievement Night the date & location to be announced at a later date.

#### **CLOVERBUD RECORD BOOKS**


