<u>4-H Camp</u>

4-H Camp will be June 11-13 this year at Silver Maple Camp in Kingman County. The cost is \$125 including all Meals, Activities and Lodging. Reno County 4-H offers \$30 in scholarships for youth to attend camp from our leadership-camp fund. Additionally, 4-H Council offers a \$25 scholarship that you can apply for. Return the application (found at the end of the newsletter) to the Extension Office by May 1. Payment is also due by May 1. Attention in the barns

If you are needing small animals tagged (sheep, goat, swine and bucket calves) please email Donna at <u>dp96929@ksu.edu</u> by April 26th with the EXACT number of each species you will be needing tagged on May 4th from 8 to 10 am behind the extension office. Tags will be \$3.50 each. When you get to the office you will pick up your packet of tags and pay for them. Then you will move on to the next station and have your animals tagged. All animals must be tagged before leaving the

grounds.

Dog identification paperwork must be turned into the office by May 1st to be eligible to show at fair.
